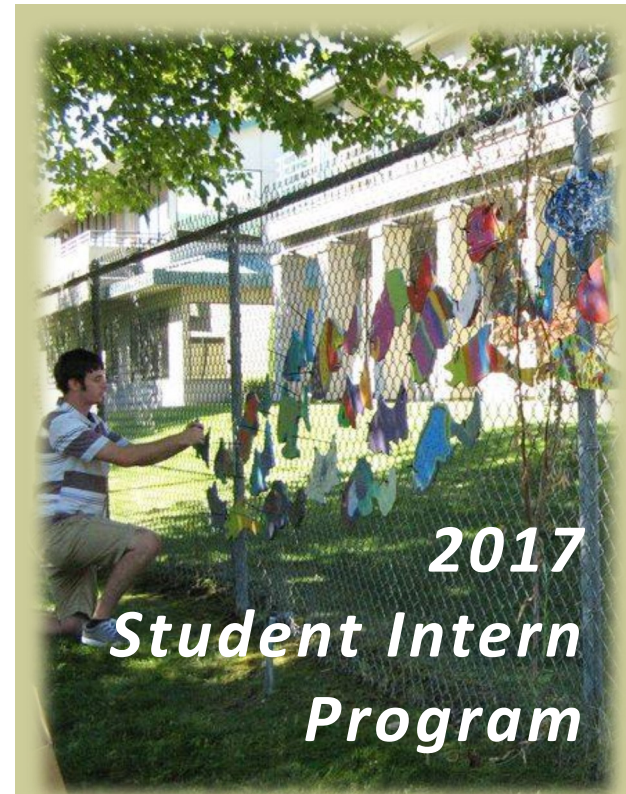

## ABOUT WENATCHEE



Wenatchee is a community of over 33,000 people located in sunny north central Washington.

The Parks, Recreation and Cultural Services Department operates a park system which includes: A 50 meter outdoor swimming pool, skate court, large open space and trail system, and 15 developed parks. The City also coordinates community special events, athletic and general recreation programs and is the primary coordinator of special needs programming in the Wenatchee Valley. Department staffing includes 4 FTE employees and up to 50 temporary program staff.

The Department is currently: Completing several property acquisition, development and construction projects; updating its comprehensive plan; exploring alternate revenue sources and preparing grant applications; coordinating community events, arts and recreation programs ranging from the Washington State Special Olympics Winter Games to Parks Wading Pool Programs and much more!

Students working in Wenatchee will get the opportunity to be involved in all aspects of departmental operations.
