Motion by Councilmember Keith Huffaker to meet in executive session to discuss with legal counsel matters of potential litigation, with legal counsel present, and for a time period not to exceed 25 minutes. Motion seconded by Councilmember Jim Bailey. Motion carried (6-0).

#### 5:15 p.m. Regular Meeting

**1.** Call to Order, Pledge of Allegiance, and Roll Call. Mayor Frank J. Kuntz called the regular meeting to order at 5:15 p.m. Councilmember Keith Huffaker led the Pledge of Allegiance. The excused absence of Councilmember Travis Hornby was noted for the record.

#### 2. Consent Items:

Motion by Councilmember Keith Huffaker to approve agenda, vouchers, and minutes from previous meetings. Councilmember Jim Bailey seconded the motion. Motion carried (6-0).

#### 3. Presentations

 Parks & Recreation Month Proclamation read by Councilmember Jose Cuevas and presented to Parks Board Chair Lyle Markhart, and Parks & Recreation staff Caryl Andre, Cammy Coble, Charlotte Mitchell, Sydney McElroy, and David Erickson.

## 4. Citizen Requests/Comments

Sloan Parker addressed the City Council about the Hale Park Skatepark and requested a policy change for park hours and that the lights be turned on in the evenings so that kids can skate longer in the day when it's cooler outside. Parks, Recreation & Cultural Services Director David Erickson addressed his concerns and Council asked questions.

Casey Cooper also spoke in support of the skatepark lights and would like to see them on all night to help combat vandalism at the park. He provided a handout to share with the Council.

After further discussion and questions by the Mayor and Council, it was the consensus that the lights be turned on until 10:00 p.m. for a two-week trial period. Staff and the Skateboard representatives will report back at the next regular Council meeting of June 22.

#### 5. Action Items

Motion by Councilmember Linda Herald for City Council to approve the Interlocal Cooperative Agreement with the Columbia River Drug Task Force and authorize the Mayor's signature. Councilmember Jose Cuevas seconded the motion. Motion carried (6-0).

**B.** Interlocal Agreement with the County of Chelan for Construction of the Knowles Road Sanitary Sewer Extension, CPN 1908

Senior Utilities Engineer Jeremy Hoover presented the staff report. Council asked questions.

Motion by Councilmember Jim Bailey for City Council to approve the Interlocal Agreement between the City of Wenatchee and Chelan County for the construction of the Knowles Road Sanitary Sewer Improvements and authorize the Mayor to sign the Agreement. Councilmember Ruth Esparza seconded the motion. Motion carried (6-0).

**C.** City Project 2005.03 – Washington Street Traffic Calming - Authorization to Award Construction Contract

Engineering Services Manager Jacob Huylar presented the staff report. Council asked questions and commented.

Motion by Councilmember Ruth Esparza for City Council to award the construction contract for the Washington Street Traffic Calming to the lowest responsible bidder, Rudnick & Sons Excavation, and authorize the Mayor to sign the construction contract documents. Councilmember Mark Kulaas seconded the motion. Motion carried (6-0).

**D.** Lincoln Park Pump Park Construction Contract Award

Parks, Recreation & Cultural Services Director David Erickson presented the staff report. Council asked questions.

Motion by Councilmember Keith Huffaker for City Council to authorize the Mayor to sign a standard construction agreement with the Evergreen Mountain Bike Alliance in the amount of \$181,448.88 for the construction of the Lincoln Park Pump Park Project. Councilmember Linda Herald seconded the motion. Motion carried (6-0).

E. DJML Annexation Public Hearing

Neighborhood & Community Services Coordinator Brooklyn Holton presented the staff report. Community Development Director Glen DeVries was also present.

### I. SUBJECT

Ordinance 2021-22 Public Hearing: 2022 – 2027 for Wenatchee Six-Year Transportation Improvement Program

## II. ACTION REQUESTED

Motion requested to... (see below for options)

- 1. Conduct a Public Hearing to solicit public comments and recommendations to the draft 2022-2027 Transportation Improvement Program after staff presentation.
- 2. Consider any modifications to the plan as presented.
- 3. Adopt Ordinance No. 2021-22 approving the annual comprehensive street plan for the ensuing six year period of 2022 through 2027 (with or without any modifications that may be desired after the public hearing).

## III. OVERVIEW

The six year transportation improvement program (TIP) describes schedules and funding sources for planned transportation projects in the city of Wenatchee. It is updated annually and submitted to the WSDOT and Chelan-Douglas Transportation Council who, in turn combine this TIP with others to create both regional and statewide plans for the ensuing year. Projects utilizing federal and state funds must be included in the TIP. The TIP is also incorporated into the city's comprehensive plan annually as an element of the Capital Facilities Plan, and is a fundamental component of implementing the Transportation Element of the city's Comprehensive Plan. The draft 2022 TIP is a result of staff updates to the currently adopted 2021 TIP which was adopted on July 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2020. After additions, deletions, and modifications to the various projects, the draft 2020 TIP shows 3 fewer projects.

"Project Identity" numbers are included in the first column on this year's form but projects have not historically been prioritized in Wenatchee's TIP. Generally projects that have allocated funding are shown as "selected" (S) under the status column and are shown in the earlier years of the plan and are listed first. Other projects that are identified but to which no funding is allocated are shown as "planned" (P) and are included after the selected projects. Some projects that will be completed this

calendar year still remain on the TIP for funding purposes. Some projects include separate entries for their phases of work (PE, R/W, CN) for funding purposes as well.

The city always has the opportunity to amend the currently adopted TIP for any necessary or desired modifications.

The 2022 – 2027 TIP carries most projects forward, adds 5 projects, deletes 8 projects, and combines some projects from the 2021 TIP. Staff priorities for revisions include completed projects, newly funded grant funded projects, projects consistent with adopted plans, and projects where grant applications are anticipated in the near future. The draft 2022 – 2027 TIP includes several revisions to the 2020 TIP as detailed in the attached plans and will be summarized by staff at the hearing.

### IV. FISCAL IMPACT

The total cost of all projects included in the plan is approximately \$370 million dollars which is again higher than the previously adopted TIP mostly due to updated cost estimates, and potential new funding. The anticipated funding sources are \$166M Federal, \$121M State, and \$82M in local funding. The plan must be fiscally constrained. Projects in the plan with a status "S" indicate projects to which funding is allocated. Project funding varies as shown in the plan and often includes federal or state grant funding combined with an arterial street fund match. The overlay fund provides funding for a portion of the street preservation program. Funding from the various city funds for selected projects is included in the annual budget.

Projects in the plan with a status "P" indicate projects to which funding is not yet secured. Many of these projects are further scoped by staff and submitted for funding to the various grant sources based on the projects' ability to compete for the available funds.

## V. PROPOSED PROJECT SCHEDULE

The annual six year transportation improvement program is expected to meet the obligations and needs for the city with respect to transportation funding. Any modifications that may be needed during the year can be considered by revising the plan through this process.

## NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF

## **WENATCHEE DO ORDAIN** as follows:

## **SECTION I**

That the 2022-2027 comprehensive six year street plan as prepared by the City Engineer of the City of Wenatchee and attached hereto as Exhibit "A," be and the same is hereby adopted.

### **SECTION II**

That a copy of said 2022-2027 comprehensive six year street plan, together with a copy of this Ordinance, be filed with the Director of Highways of the State of Washington, as provided in Chapter 83, Section 27, 1967 Ex. Sess. Laws of the State of Washington.
