

## Introduction and Project Purpose

The Urban Design Corridor Vision for N Wenatchee Avenue responds to a strong desire by stakeholders to improve the image and visual character of the corridor. In tandem with the overall project goal of alleviating corridor congestion, the public and stakeholders would like to see a more favorable aesthetic appeal for the roadway. This report summarizes the discussions and design concepts that can be applied to the future design of the corridor.



# Key Project Goals


Key Project Goals from stakeholders for N Wenatchee Avenue include:



The second and fourth goals focus on creating a welcoming place, with distinctive character, that supports the adjacent business environment and makes it safer for pedestrians. This "placemaking" desire recognizes that the corridor does not feel inviting. In this regard, it does not create a welcoming gateway to the city, or support the adjacent businesses as an attractive destination. Stakeholders have clearly expressed their desires that the corridor look more attractive and becomes more inviting. This can be accomplished through proposed infrastructure improvements that create safer multimodal facilities, and can include streetscape "placemaking" enhancements that will improve the corridor as a welcoming place for all who use it.

## Connecting Users to Functional Safe Facilities

There are many types of users for N Wenatchee Avenue including:



Each type of user requires certain types of facilities that will accommodate their specific needs. For example, pedestrian facilities are designed to provide for safe, buffered space from vehicles and provide safe street crossings designed for ADA access. The same is true for transit facilities. LINK Transit bus stops are designed for safe pick up and drop off, including bicycle storage and ADA access. Roadway facilities need to be designed to accommodate large vehicles (trucks and buses), in order to manuever around corners and on/off properties and also designed to accommodate emergency vehicles in time of need. Combined, all facilities must balance mobility for all users who share the corridor.


# Distilling from these features, themes, and qualities

To create quality connections to Wenatchee's past and future with materials that provide a "look and feel" throughout the corridor improvements.


Great placemaking reflects the unique character of the place. For N Wenatchee Avenue, there is a wealth of unique place and cultural features that can be reflected in the look of the corridor. Distilling themes from these features can provide qualities that can be reflected in the materials and design elements used to construct improvements to the corridor. There are many features unique to Wenatchee that can be infused, and stakeholders embraced these many layers including agriculture, technology, arts and culture, and natural geology.

# Distilling a Feature: Example - Natural Geology

As an example for extracting a unique local feature, Wenatchee's setting has the obvious theme of "Natural Geology". The natural geology derives from ice age remnants left behind from the geologic occurance of giant boulders tumbled by the force of massive floodwaters, or floated on ice to eventually settle onto the soil. The layers of geologic history, eroded by the Wenatchee and Columbia Rivers, include many features that make this area so unique. Elements include Wenatchee's oldest rock formation (93 million years old) found beneath the bedrock, hanging valleys, pillow basalts and faceted spurs, as well as the site of the largest landslide in Washington State history, the Malaga slide. From this knowledge and understanding, themes and qualities can be refinedw and translated into project elements for the corridor (please note the following examples are not proposed solutions for N Wenatchee Avenue).





# Streetscape Design Concepts

The design of N Wenatchee Avenue, both roadway and streetscape, has the opportunity to become a more safe, accessible, and inviting place. The vision should take the many design elements and locate them along the corridor for both functionality, and corridor placemaking. The image below focuses on the north end of the corridor, and shows that appropriate lighting, street trees, rockscape, and landscape can provide a significant visual change for the corridor, and truly enhance its character. The following page illustrates conceptually how these design elements not only improve visual character of the corridor, but also enhance pedestrian connections, roadway connections, and transit connections. This corridor can be a gateway for the city, and support existing businesses.
