#### **REGULAR AGENDA:**

- 1. May 17, 2022 Commission Meeting Minutes. *Commissioner Harmon moved approval of the May* 17, 2022 meeting minutes. *Commissioner Koski seconded the motion. The motion passed 7-0.*
- 2. Election of Officers. After a brief discussion, Commissioner Koester moved to appoint Commissioner Harmon as Vice Chair of the Commission. Commissioner Rohrbach seconded the motion and it passed unanimously. Commissioner Harmon moved to appoint Commissioner Koester as Secretary of the Commission. Commissioner Koski seconded the motion and it passed unanimously. Commissioner Markhart volunteered to serve on the Arts sub-Committee.
- **3. Highway 2 / Easy Roundabout Art Update.** The Department Director provided an update on the Highway 2 Roundabout art. The tree concept is moving to the engineering phase. He contacted the artist working on the North Wenatchee Avenue Project about the potential to incorporate some of the banner art imagery into the roundabout fins.
- 4. **Riverfront Park Update.** Commissioner Koski, reported on the kick off meetings to review artwork relocation and train operations for the first phase of the implementation of the project. The meetings were also attended by Commissioners Markhart, Harmon and Mott. This phase includes splash pad, play equipment and picnic shelter additions and train and trail work.

- 5. Wastewater Treatment Plant Art Fund Project. Deputy Public Works Director Jessica Shaw presented a request to include a visual improvement/art project for the east fence line of the sewer treatment plant into the art capital plan and utilize art funds to help realize the implementation. The fence area is unsightly and should be improved with the work that is planned for the area of Riverfront Park. Several examples of decorative fencing and murals were provided. *Commissioner Koski moved approval of the addition of the project into the art capital plan. Commissioner Rohrbach seconded and the motion passed 7-0.*
- 6. Mountain Bike Proposal. Representatives from Evergreen Mountain Bike Alliance and Wenatchee High School attended the meeting and presented a request and information about creating a mountain bike park on property near Saddle Rock that the City is endeavoring to acquire. They cited Eagle Idaho as a good example of a similar municipally run park. There are several steps that need to occur for this project to reach fruition including acquiring the property, adding it to the comprehensive plan and capital plan, develop the concept plan and securing funding. The two groups were willing to assist with the realization of the project. No action was taken however staff will work with the groups to continue the process.
- **7. 2023 Budget.** The department director provided a spreadsheet of the first round of potential budget items for 2023. The budget refinement process will continue through November.
- **5. Project Updates.** Along with the report provided in the agenda packet, the Department Director provided updates on the construction projects currently in progress, the City pool, and a car wreck in Rotary Park.
- 6. Grant report. A report was included in the agenda packet.
- 7. **City Council items.** A list of City Council items was provided.

### **BACKGROUND:**

The following is an update of current grant related work. New information is highlighted in ORANGE.

RCO = State of Washington Recreation Conservation Office **YAF** = Youth Athletic Facility Account WWRP = Washington Wildlife and Recreation Program LWCF = Land and Water Conservation Fund

#### **Chelan Douglas Developmental Disabilities Grants**

The grant provides funding support of the Special Needs Social Program. Presented an \$8,500 request for the 2022/23 program year. The grant was successful.

#### Lincoln Park RCO Youth Athletic Facilities Grant

The \$263,192 grant would construct the full-size soccer/lacrosse field, new restrooms and safety fencing in Lincoln Park. Construction underway. Grant billing submitted.

#### Lincoln Park Improvement RCO WWRP Local Parks Grant

The \$500,000 grant will replace the stage and play area; add a water play area, second picnic shelter, bmx pump park, trees and upgrade utilities and parking in Lincoln Park. Construction underway. Grant billing submitted.

#### Lincoln Park Improvement RCO LWCF Grant

The \$500,000 grant application will replace the stage and play area; add a water play area, second picnic shelter, bmx pump park, trees and upgrade utilities and parking in Lincoln Park. Construction underway. Grant billing submitted.

#### Kenzie's Landing RCO WWRP Local Parks Grant

The \$1,000,000 acquisition/development grant application acquires approximately 60 acres, construct an access road, improve fire protection and construct trailhead in the northwest foothills Construction underway. Grant billing submitted.

#### **Department of Ecology Remedial Action Grant**

A second \$1,244,170 grant for the second phase of the Saddle Rock remediation project was approved. The pre-construction meeting was held on July 8. Construction scheduled to get underway July 18.

#### **City Pool RCO Youth Athletic Facilities Grant**

The \$350,000 grant application to provide a portion of the funding required to replace the plaster liner and tiles in the pool. **Construction bids were due July 5 and are scheduled for City Council consideration on July 14.** 

#### State Capital Budget Request

Worked with Senator Hawkins, submitted and received a \$533,500 capital budget request for the pool project. Grant acceptance scheduled for City Council consideration on July 14 Construction bids were due July 5 and are scheduled for City Council consideration on July 14.

#### Foothills RCO WWRP Local Parks Grant

This project will acquire approximately 650 acres in the foothills for non-motorized recreation, education and habitat purposes. Appraisals, Property Negotiations, Cultural Resources ongoing. Environmental Reviews completed. Acquisition of two of the three parcels are close to completion and are just waiting for the appraisals to be finalized.

#### **Chelan County LTAC Grant**

The \$183,000 grant request is to assist with the funding of the Lincoln Park soccer field. The project was funded at the \$100,000 level. **Construction underway.** 

#### **Chelan County Distressed County Fund Request**

A \$300,000 request will assist with the funding of the Lincoln Park Project. \$115,200 was approved for the project and the grant agreement was accepted by the City. **Construction underway.** 

#### **Community Development Block Grant (CDBG)**

This request would provide CDBG funding to assist with funding the Lincoln Park Project. \$200,000 was budgeted for the project. **Construction underway.** 

#### **Risk Management Service Agency Loss Control Grant Request**

A \$10,000 request was prepared and submitted to assist with the funding of the Lincoln Park play area portion of the project. Fall Material ordered and should arrive on site any day. Once invoice received, the grant billing will be processed.

#### **RCO WWRP Local Parks Grant**

This project will acquire approximately 134 acres in the foothills for non-motorized recreation, education and habitat purposes. The application was presented at the Technical Review Meeting on June 9. It will be presented for the final time at the Project Evaluation Meetings August 22-26. Results will be available in October.
