I. SUBJECT

WSDOT Roundabout at US Highway 2/97 and Easy Street Detour Agreement

II. ACTION REQUESTED

Motion requested that the City Council authorize the Mayor to sign the Local Agency Detour Agreement #HR2 0148 in substantial conformance with the attached draft version.

III. OVERVIEW

The Washington State Department of Transportation (WSDOT) is planning to construct a multi-lane roundabout at the intersection of US Highway 2/97 and Easy Street. To facilitate construction, WSDOT has requested to use the city street network – Easy St, Penny Rd, Euclid Ave, and Ohme Garden Rd – as a detour route. Thru traffic on US 2/97 will remain on the state highway system but access to Easy St will not be permitted. Additionally, traffic from northbound SR 285 (N Wenatchee Ave) will be required to detour through Olds Station in order to travel east across the Odabashian Bridge. An exhibit showing the proposed detour routes is attached for reference.

The detour agreement includes a process for the city's streets to be inspected both before and after use as a detour route; WSDOT will be responsible to restore city streets to pre-existing conditions. WSDOT will also be responsible to provide updated timing for the city's traffic signal at Easy St and Penny Rd due to the increased volume on northbound Easy St.

WSDOT and the city have agreed to terms on two additional clauses that will be added to the final version of the agreement. They are as follows:

- Traffic Enforcement: If either WSDOT or the City of Wenatchee identify traffic
 enforcement needs on the detour route, WSDOT agrees to pay for contracted
 enforcement from either the Washington State Patrol or Wenatchee Police
 Department. The parties will agree upon the date, time, and place of the required
 enforcement.
- Mutual Indemnification: Each Party to this Agreement will protect, defend, indemnify, and save harmless the other Party, its officers, officials, employees, and agents, while acting within the scope of their employment as such, from any and all

costs, claims, judgments, and/or awards of damages (both to persons and property), arising out of, or in any way resulting from, each Party's negligent acts or omissions with respect to the provisions of this Agreement. Neither Party will be required to indemnify, defend, or save harmless the other Party if the claim, suit, or action for injuries, death, or damages (both to persons and property) is caused by the sole negligence of the other Party. Where such claims, suits, or actions result from the concurrent negligence of the Parties, their agents, officials or employees, and/or involve those actions covered by RCW 4.24.115, the indemnity provisions provided herein will be valid and enforceable only to the extent of the negligence of the indemnifying Party, its agents, officials or employees.

The Parties agree that their obligations under this section extend to any claim, demand, and/or cause of action brought by, or on behalf of, any of their officers, officials, employees or agents. For this purpose only, the Parties, by mutual negotiation, hereby waive, with respect to each other only, any immunity that would otherwise be available against such claims under the Industrial Insurance provisions of Title 51 RCW.

This indemnification and waiver will survive the termination of this Agreement.

IV. FISCAL IMPACT

V. PROPOSED PROJECT SCHEDULE

WSDOT intends to advertise the project for bids in December of 2022. Work is expected to begin in the spring of 2023 and last for 65 working days. The detour will be in place 24 hours per day for the entirety of the project.

Local Agency Haul Road/Detour Agreement WSDOT Agreement #HR2 0148

This Agreement is between the Washington State Department of Transportation (WSDOT) and the City of Wenatchee (Local Agency) hereinafter referred to individually as the 'Party' and collectively as the 'Parties.' Recitals

- 1. WSDOT is planning the construction or improvement of a section of state highway as shown above, and
- 2. In the construction of the project it is planned to use, for the purpose noted above, those LOCAL AGENCY roads or streets described above and as further detailed in red on the attached Exhibit "A", and
- 3. It is anticipated that as a result of the use of these roads or streets, additional maintenance expense may be incurred by the Local Agency.

Now Therefore, It Is Mutually Agreed As Follows:

1. The Local Agency hereby agrees to WSDOT's use of the roads or streets covered by this Agreement subject to the conditions contained herein.

- 2. Immediately prior to the beginning of WSDOT's use of the above described roads or streets, the parties to this Agreement shall make a joint condition inspection and WSDOT shall prepare a memorandum record of the condition of said roads or streets. The memorandum record shall include a statement of the extent and frequency of routine maintenance operations normally carried out by the Local Agency on said roads or streets and may include photographs showing condition of the existing roadway.
- 3. WSDOT shall restore, to its former condition or better, any portion of the City roadways which are damaged during use as the State's detour route.
- 4. Upon completion of use of the roads or streets covered by this Agreement, a joint inspection shall be made by the parties to determine the condition of said roads or streets. All maintenance and/or repairs shall be based upon the conditions of these roads or streets at the time of this completion inspection, taking into account the memorandum record made under Section 2.
- 5. It is expressly understood that WSDOT shall be responsible only for that extra maintenance and repairs of the Local Agency's roads or streets occasioned by the project use.
- 6. The Parties shall work collaboratively to resolve disputes and issues arising out of, or related to, this Agreement. Disagreements shall be resolved promptly and at the lowest level of hierarchy. To this end, following the dispute resolution process shown below shall be a prerequisite to the filing of litigation concerning any dispute between the Parties:

A. The Parties shall use their best efforts to resolve disputes and issues arising out of or related to this Agreement. They shall communicate regularly to discuss the status of the tasks to be performed hereunder and to resolve any disputes or issues related to the successful performance of this Agreement. They shall cooperate in providing staff support to facilitate the performance of this Agreement and the resolution of any disputes or issues arising during the term of this Agreement.

- B. A Party shall notify the other Party in writing of any dispute or issue that they believe may require formal resolution contained herein. They shall meet within five (5) working days of receiving the written notice and attempt to resolve the dispute.
- C. In the event they cannot resolve the dispute or issue, the Local Agency and WSDOT's Region Administrator, or their respective designees, shall meet and engage in good faith negotiations to resolve the dispute.
- D. In the event the Local Agency and WSDOT's Region Administrator, or their respective designees, cannot resolve the dispute or issue, they shall each appoint a member to a Dispute Board. These two members shall then select a third member not affiliated with either Party. The three-member board shall conduct a dispute resolution hearing that shall be informal and unrecorded. All expenses for the third member of the Dispute Board shall be shared equally by both Parties; however, each Party shall be responsible for its own costs and fees.

If it is necessary for either party to utilize the services of an attorney to enforce any of the terms of this agreement, each party shall be responsible for its own attorney fees and costs.

- 7. The Local Agency agrees not to restrict below legal limits the size, weight, or speed of vehicles using the roads or streets covered by this Agreement except as stated above under Vehicle Restrictions.
- 8. No liability shall attach to WSDOT or the Local Agency by reason of entering into this Agreement except as expressly provided herein.
- 9. Counterparts and Electronic Signature. This Agreement may be executed in counterparts or in duplicate originals. Each counterpart or each duplicate shall be deemed an original copy signed by each Party, for all purposes. Electronic signatures or signatures transmitted via e-mail in a "PDF" may be used in place of original signatures. Each Party intends to be bound by its electronic or "PDF" signature and is aware that the other Parties are relying on its electronic or "PDF" signature.

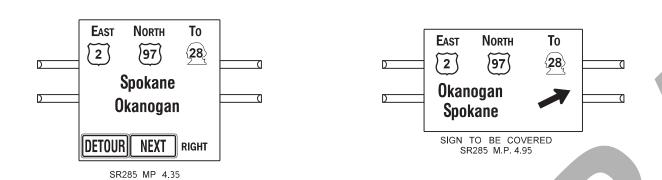

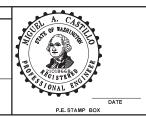


EXISTING SIGN MODIFICATION DETAIL

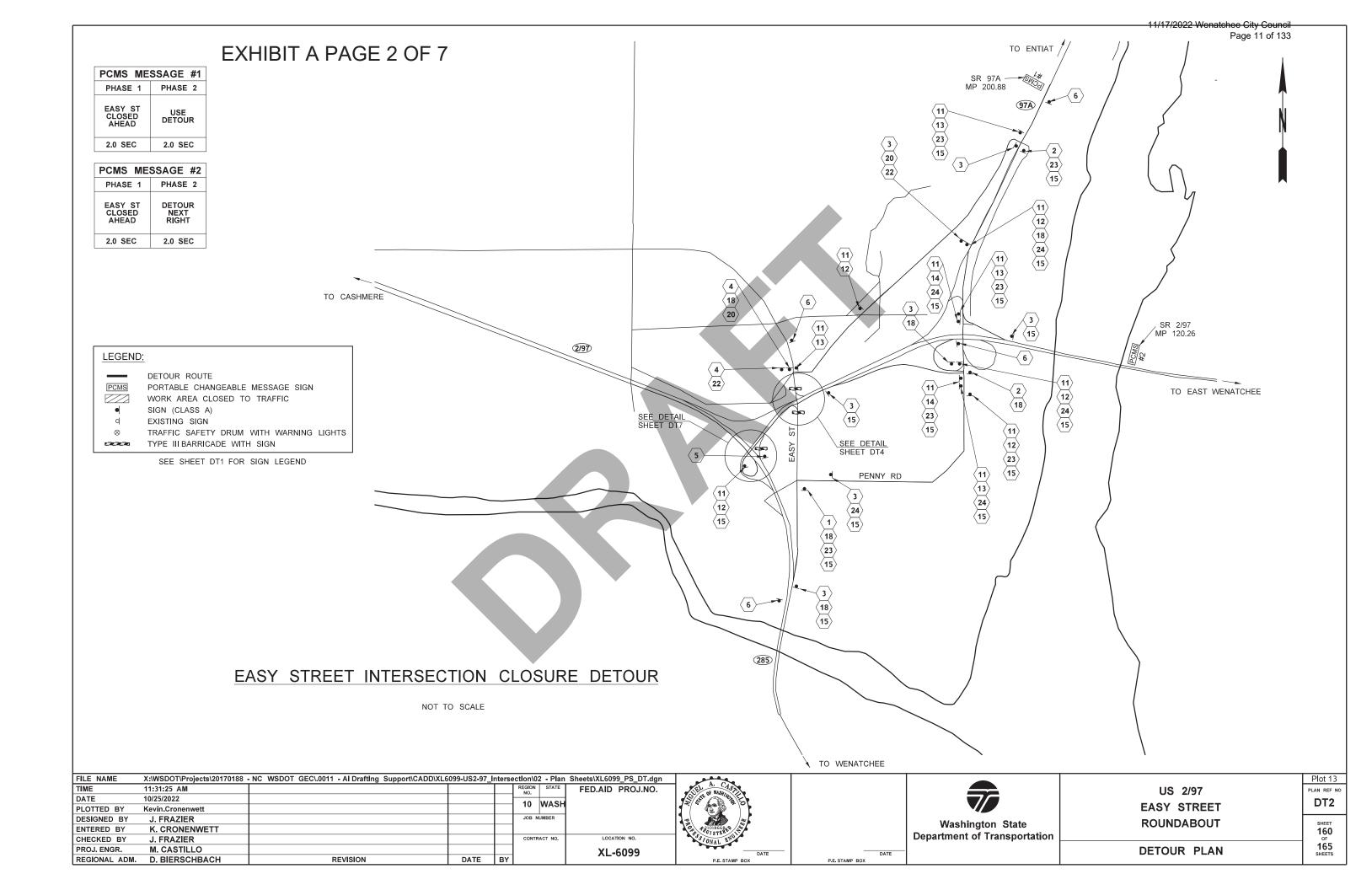
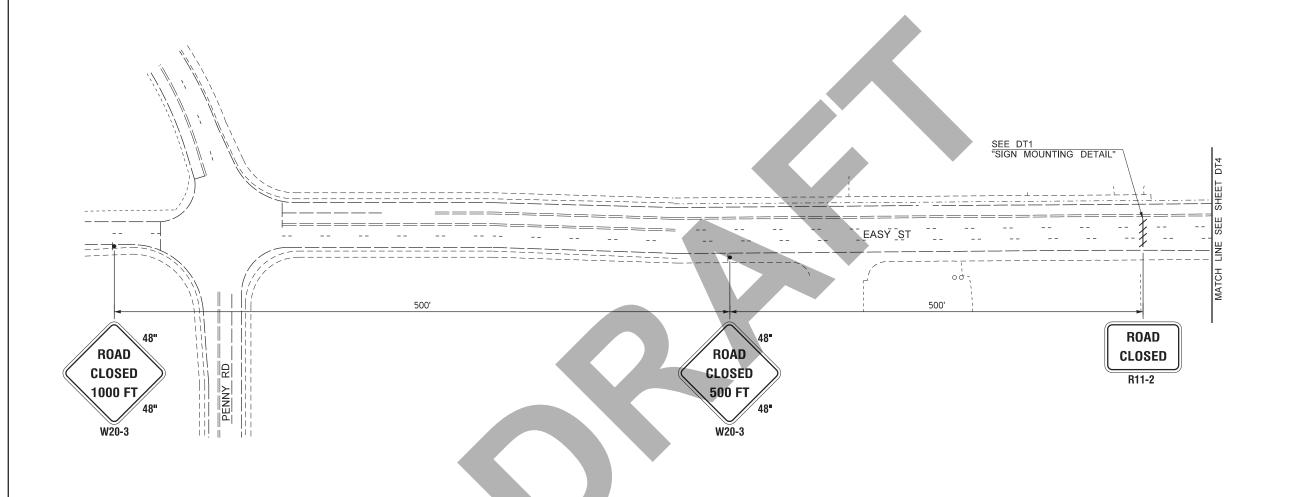
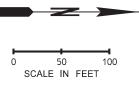

EASY ST CLOSURE SEE TR1 FOR SIGNING DETAIL, NOTES, AND LEGEND



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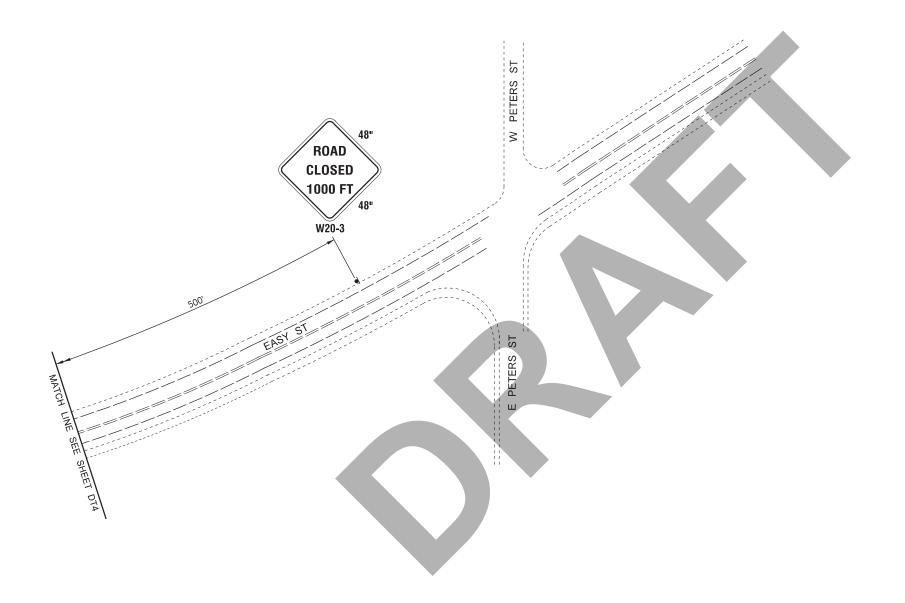


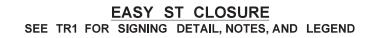

EXHIBIT B

The US 2/97 Easy St Roundabout Project is an intersection improvement project that will improve mobility and reduce the potential of collisions and collision severity at the intersection of US 2/97 and Easy St. The Project limits are from US 2 Between MP 118.97 and 119.37. Work on this project will include removing the existing signalized intersection and install a multi-lane roundabout.

The construction of the roundabout will be done through multiple stages and will require closures on the off ramp along SR 285 to US 2/97, as well as Easy St north and south of the intersection. The closures will be in place 24/7 for the duration of the contract which is estimated 65 working days.

During the closures, traffic will be detoured along Euclid Avenue, Penny Rd, Easy St, and Ohme Gardens Rd. WSDOT will provide the city with updated programming for the signal at Easy St and Penny Rd. The detour will be in place 24/7 through the duration of the contract. The Detour plans for each ramp closure can be found in Exhibit A.

I. SUBJECT

City Project 0623/1615/1919 – McKittrick Street (North Wenatchee Ave to BNSF) Interlocal Agreement with Chelan County PUD

II. ACTION REQUESTED

Staff recommends the City Council authorize the Mayor to approve the Interlocal Agreement between the City of Wenatchee and Public Utility No. 1 of Chelan County, providing for the reimbursement of costs incurred with the design and construction of electrical and fiber utilities associated with Project 0623/1615/1919.

III. OVERVIEW

Three separate federally funded projects (N Columbia St Improvements, McKittrick St & N Wenatchee Avenue Signal, and North Wenatchee Avenue Pedestrian and Median Improvements) have been combined for bidding and construction purposes. The combined project will construct a new traffic signal at N Wenatchee Ave and McKittrick St, median and sidewalk improvements along N Wenatchee Ave, extend McKittrick east toward BSNF and a new intersection with N Columbia St (which is also constructed by the project).

The project includes providing power and fiber utilities to the parcels along N Columbia Street. The Public Utility District No. 1 of Chelan County (PUD) notified the City of its desire to install new 600-ampere electrical and single-mode broadband (fiber) underground utility lines across North Wenatchee Avenue with the project in order to effectively serve immediate and future land development within the City's adopted North Wenatchee Master Plan (2016). The additional cost to install a 600-amp service will be funded by the PUD. Staff negotiated this agreement for design and construction costs, and the agreement is now ready to be executed by the City.

IV. FISCAL IMPACT

The project budget (as amended) was approved by Finance Committee and City Council on November 18, 2021.

V. PROPOSED PROJECT SCHEDULE

The project will be advertised for construction Winter 2022 and construction is anticipated Spring 2023.

INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT

City of Wenatchee and Public Utility District No. 1 of Chelan County CCPUD Contract No. 22-12343

THIS INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT ("Agreement") is hereby entered into on the Effective Date by and between the CITY OF WENATCHEE ("City"), and PUBLIC UTILITY DISTRICT NO. 1 OF CHELAN COUNTY ("District"), sometimes individually referred to as "Party" or collectively as the "Parties."

RECITALS

The City is engaged in a street improvement project involving construction of a new intersection and extension of McKittrick Street located in Wenatchee, Washington ("Project").

The City notified the District of their desire for the District to provide certain electrical and fiber services throughout the Project area in preparation for future development.

The District notified the City of its desire to install new 600-ampere electrical and single-mode broadband (fiber) underground utility lines across North Wenatchee Avenue in order to effectively serve immediate and future land development within the City's adopted North Wenatchee Master Plan (2016).

The City's engineering consultant and District staff have worked cooperatively through the design phase of the Project pursuant to the requirements set forth in the Utility System Franchise Agreement between the Parties, dated February 18, 2005 (City Ordinance No. 2005-03).

As a result of the cooperative planning meetings held by the Parties, the District has supplied to the City detailed plans and specifications for the District's utility system facilities work, which includes the installation of unoccupied electrical distribution and broadband (fiber) system conduits, vaults, and related appurtenance work (collectively referred to hereafter as "Utility Work"), for inclusion as an addition in the City's public bid package for the Project.

The Parties desire to continue their cooperative efforts through procurement and construction of the Utility Work as set forth in this Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises and covenants herein contained, the foregoing Recitals, which are incorporated by this reference into the Agreement, City and District agree as follows:

1. **Purpose.** The purpose of this Agreement is to provide for the cooperation of the Parties for the design, public bidding, and construction of the Utility Work required for the McKittrick Street Extension Project.



- 2. Scope of Work. The Scope of Work contemplated by the Parties under this Agreement includes the Utility Work for the Project as defined below and as further identified in the plans and specifications provided to the City:
 - City's Contractor shall install the 600 amp electrical and single mode fiber duct and vault system.
 - District shall provide on-site inspection during construction;
 - District shall provide conduit and vaults required for 600 amp electrical and single mode fiber duct system (Materials);
 - District shall perform installation of electrical equipment and conductor and fiber cable and equipment. This includes materials required for installation.
- 3. Project Funding. The District and the City shall fund the construction of the Project as follows:
 - 3.1. The City will pay the City's contractor to perform the installation of the 600 amp electrical and single mode fiber duct and vault system. The District will reimburse the City for two-thirds (2/3) of the direct costs associated with the installation of the 600 amp electric and single mode fiber duct and vault system including costs added for related Utility Work added via Change Order(s).
 - 3.2. One-third (1/3) of the costs incurred for District performing the installation of electrical equipment and conductor and fiber cable and equipment, including provision of materials, shall be deducted from the District's 2/3 share of the City's contractors invoice for the work described in paragraph 3.1.
 - 3.3. Any changes required to complete the Utility Work performed by the City's contractor shall be initiated by change order. All changes to the Utility Work shall be mutually agreed upon in writing by both Parties prior to the execution of the change order.
 - 3.4. The District's financial obligation under this Agreement shall not exceed \$475,000 without execution of an amendment to this Agreement by the Parties.
- **4. District's Obligations.** In addition to the obligations provided elsewhere herein, the District shall:
 - 4.1. Participate in developing detailed plans and specifications for the Utility Work with the City in cooperation with the City's engineering consultant(s) for inclusion in its public bid package.
 - 4.2. Perform prompt inspection, final approval, and dispute resolution for that portion of the Project related to the Utility Work included under the scope of this Agreement. The District shall promptly comment on completed Utility Work when requested by the City.
 - 4.3. Provide materials from District's inventory as needed for the Utility Work.

5. City's Obligations. City shall:

- 5.1. Develop plans and specifications for the Project including incorporating District-provided plans and specifications prescribing the Utility Work.
- 5.2. Administer the bidding and contract award, consistent with public bid laws for the Project, including:



- a) Preparing bid documents;
- b) Providing bid documents to the District for District's review and approval prior to advertising for construction bids;
- c) Advertising for construction bids;
- d) Providing bids for District approval;
- e) Award of the construction contract to the lowest responsible and responsive bid.
- 5.3. Subject to the provisions of this Agreement, administer the Project construction contract, including:
 - a.) Disbursement of payments to the Project contractor (subject to District's approval in advance);
 - b.) Scheduling the construction work;
 - c.) Alert the District of any utility conflicts immediately;
 - d.) Administration of change orders (subject to District's approval in advance);
 - e.) Coordinating and providing all inspection and permitting necessary to the Project; and
 - f.) Coordinating final acceptance of the Project following construction, including, inter alia, obtaining the District's written acknowledgement of Project completion prior to final acceptance of the Project.
- 5.4. Be responsible for the administration, management and budget for this Project.
- **6. Duration and Termination.** This Agreement shall become effective upon the Effective Date. This Agreement will terminate upon the final payment for the Utility Work is received by the City from the District.
- 7. Cost. Pursuant to Section 3, the District shall reimburse the City for costs associated with the Utility Work performed by City's contractor on the Project, including Washington State sales tax. Costs shall be determined by actual quantity and bid item cost for the Utility Work, set out in the lowest responsible bid included in the City Project contract for the entire Project, plus any change orders attributable to accommodating the Utility Work. Said costs shall be approved by the District.
- **8. Payment.** Upon receipt of a correct invoice from the City, the District shall make payments to the City consistent with Sections 3 and 7. Payment will be due within 30 days of the date a correct invoice from the City is received by the District.
- 9. Records. City and District shall keep and maintain accurate and complete cost records pertaining to their respective portions of the Project. Each Party shall have full access and the right to examine any such records during the term of this Agreement. All records, books, documents and other materials maintained, prepared, or issued by the District in the implementation of this Agreement shall be the property of the District, which shall have the responsibility of the retention and release of those materials.
- **10.Mutual Indemnity.** The District shall indemnify, defend and hold harmless the City, it's officers, agents and employees, from and against any and all claims, losses or liability, or any portion thereof, arising from injury or death to persons or damage to property occasioned by any negligent act, omission or failure of the District, its officers, agents, and employees, in



connection with the District's activities related to this Agreement described in this Agreement, or arising out of the District's, its officer's, agent's and/or employee's non-observance or non-performance of any law, ordinance, or regulation applicable to this Agreement.

The indemnification obligation of District shall not be limited in any way by the application of any workmen's compensation acts, disability benefit acts or other employee benefit acts and the District expressly waives the protection afforded by such laws. The foregoing waiver and indemnification obligations have been mutually negotiated.

The City shall indemnify, defend and hold harmless the District, it's officers, agents, employees, contractors, and subcontractors from and against any and all claims, losses or liability, or any portion thereof, arising from injury or death to persons or damage to property occasioned by any negligent act, omission or failure of the City, its officers, agents, employees, Contractor and subcontractors in connection with the City's activities related to this Agreement, or arising out of the City's, its officer's, agent's, employee's, Contractor's and/or subcontractor's non-observance or non-performance of any law, ordinance, or regulation applicable to the City's activities related to this Agreement.

The indemnification obligation of the City shall not be limited in any way by the application of any workmen's compensation acts, disability benefit acts or other employee benefit acts and the City expressly waives the protection afforded by such laws, The foregoing waiver and indemnification obligations have been mutually negotiated. .

- 11. Severability. In the event that any provision of this Agreement shall be determined to be unenforceable or otherwise invalid for any reason, such provision shall be enforced and validated to the extent permitted by law. All other provisions of this Agreement are severable, and the unenforceability or invalidity of any single provision hereof shall not affect the remaining provisions.
- **12.Attorney's Fees.** In the event of litigation regarding any of the terms of this Agreement, each Party shall pay their own attorney's fees and costs.
- **13.Construction.** This Agreement contains the entire agreement between the Parties with respect to the subject matter hereof and supersedes all prior agreements or understandings among the Parties with respect thereto. This Agreement may be amended only by an agreement in writing signed by the Parties.
- **14. Mutual Negotiation and Construction.** This Agreement and each of the terms and provisions hereof are deemed to have been explicitly negotiated between, and mutually drafted by, the Parties, and the language in all parts of this Agreement shall, in all cases, be construed according to its fair meaning and not strictly for or against either Party.
- **15.Governing Law; Venue.** This Agreement is governed by the laws of the state of Washington, without regard to its conflict of law provisions. The jurisdiction of any action hereunder shall be in the Superior Court, Chelan County, Washington.



- 16. Public Disclosure. The obligations of the parties regarding confidential information may be subject to state and federal public disclosure laws, as now exist or as may be hereafter amended. The Parties may disclose confidential information to the extent it is required to be disclosed pursuant to the public disclosure laws. If a public disclosure of confidential information is requested, the Party receiving the request agrees to notify the other of such request at least ten (10) business days prior to disclosure being made. The other Party may immediately seek a protective order in the appropriate court. The receiving Party will reasonably cooperate with the other in such action, but is under no obligation to obtain or seek any court protection.
- 17. Relationship of Parties. The Parties intend that an independent contractor relationship will be created by this Agreement. The conduct and control of the Project construction contract and safety measures required by said contract lie solely with the City and its Contractor. Neither Party, their officers, employees, agents, contractors or subcontractors shall be considered an agent or employee of the other for any purpose and neither Party is entitled to any of the benefits that the other provides for its respective employees.
- **18.Termination for Material Breach.** Except as otherwise provided for herein, if either Party fails to cure any material breaches of this Agreement which are described in a written Notice from the other Party within thirty (30) days of receipt of such Notice, this Agreement may be terminated immediately, in whole or in part, by Notice from the non-breaching Party.

19. Notices.

- Any notice or demand or other communication required or permitted to be given under this Agreement or applicable law ("Notice") shall be effective if and only if it is in writing, properly addressed, and either delivered in person, or by a recognized courier service, or deposited with the United States Postal Service as first class certified mail, postage prepaid, certified mail, return receipt requested, via facsimile or by electronic mail, to the parties at the addresses and fax number, and email addresses provided below the signatures to this Agreement.
- 18.2 Notices shall be effective upon receipt or four (4) business days after mailing, whichever is earlier. The Notice address as provided herein may be changed by Notice given as provided above.

I. SUBJECT

Multi-Family Tax Exemption Agreement with DJML, LLC.

II. <u>ACTION REQUESTED</u>

A motion to adopt Resolution 2022-29 authorizing the execution of an 8-year Multi-Family Housing Limited Property Tax Exemption Agreement with DJML, LLC.

III. OVERVIEW

The attached Resolution 2022-29 authorizes the City of Wenatchee and DJML, LLC to enter into an agreement under the City's Multi-Family Tax Exemption (MFTE) program found in WCC 5.88 and RCW 8.14.

The Resolution authorizes the issuance of a Conditional Certificate of Acceptance of Tax Exemption associated with the construction of a 4-unit residential project at 1710 Springwater Avenue.

Upon completion of the project and fulfillment of the terms of the agreement, the City will issue a Final Certificate of Tax Exemption that exempts the residential development from property tax for a period of eight (8) years. The exemption applies to housing improvements and does not include the land or any non-residential area. The project is not providing affordable housing units as a component of this agreement.

An annual report is required to be completed each year the tax exemption is active, to document compliance with the requirements of the program.

IV. FISCAL IMPACT

No direct impacts to the City budget. The city will receive annual property tax on the land where the completed projects is located. The amount of property tax for the land is anticipated to be greater than or equal to the current assessed value of the non-occupied property.

WHEREAS, the City has, pursuant to RCW 84.14 et. seq. designated a Residential Target Area for the allowance of a limited property tax exemption for new multi-family residential housing; and

WHEREAS, the City of Wenatchee has codified in Wenatchee City Code (WCC) Chapter 5.88, a program whereby property owners in a Residential Target Area may qualify for a Final Certificate of Tax Exemption which certifies to the Chelan County Assessor that the owner is eligible to receive a limited property tax exemption; and

WHEREAS, DJML, LLC proposes to construct a 4-unit residential project at 1710 Springwater Avenue, Wenatchee, Washington; and

WHEREAS, 1710 Springwater Avenue is within the Residential Target
Area; and

WHEREAS, DJML, LLC has applied to the City to receive an eight (8) year limited property tax exemption for the proposed project; and

WHEREAS, the City's tax exemption program requires DJML, LLC to enter into an agreement with the City regarding the terms and conditions of the project.

MULTIFAMILY HOUSING LIMITED PROPERTY TAX EXEMPTION AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT is entered into on the date signed below between DJML, LLC, hereinafter referred to as the "Applicant," and the City of Wenatchee, Washington, a municipal corporation hereinafter referred to as "City."

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the Applicant has applied for a limited property tax exemption as provided for in Chapter 84.14 RCW and WCC 5.88, as amended, for constructing multifamily residential housing in Wenatchee's designated residential target area; and

WHEREAS, the Applicant has submitted to the City preliminary site plans and floor plans for new or rehabilitated mixed-use with multifamily residential housing to be constructed on property situated approximately at 1710 Springwater Avenue and described more specifically as follows:

Parcel number – 232033330270

Legal description: T 23N R 20EWM S 33 SS#1510 PARCEL 3

hereinafter referred to as the "Property;" and

WHEREAS, the City has determined that the improvements for permanent residential will, if completed as proposed, satisfy the requirements for a Final Certificate of Tax Exemption.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises herein, City and Applicant do mutually agree as follows:

- 1. City agrees, upon execution of this Agreement following approval by the City Council, to issue a Conditional Certificate of Acceptance of Tax Exemption, which conditional certificate shall expire three (3) years from the date of approval of this Agreement by the Council unless extended by the Community Development Director as provided in WCC 5.88.
- 2. Agreement to construct improvements.
 - a. The Applicant agrees to construct on the Property multifamily residential housing substantially as described in the site plans, floor plans, and elevations attached hereto, subject to such modifications thereto as may be required to comply with applicable codes and

ordinances, that in no event shall such construction provide fewer than four new multifamily residential units for permanent residential occupancy, nor shall such permanent residential housing comprise less than fifty percent of the space intended for housing within a residential or mixed-use structure constructed pursuant to this Agreement.

- b. The Applicant agrees to comply with all applicable zoning requirements, land use regulations, and building and housing code requirements in effect at the time of new construction, rehabilitation or conversion, and further agrees that approval of this Agreement by the City Council, its execution by the Mayor or his/her designee, or issuance of a Conditional Certificate of Acceptance of Tax Exemption by the City pursuant to WCC 5.88 in no way constitutes approval of proposed improvements on the Property with respect to applicable provisions of said ordinance or obligates the City to approve proposed improvements.
 - c. The Applicant agrees that the improvements will be completed within three years from the date of approval of this Agreement by the City Council, unless extended by the Community Development Director for cause as provided in WCC 5.88.

3. Requirements for Final Certificate of Tax Exemption.

The Applicant agrees, upon completion of the improvements and upon issuance by the City of a temporary or permanent Certificate of Occupancy, to file with the City's Department of Community Development the following:

- a. A statement of expenditures made with respect to each multifamily housing unit and the total expenditures made with respect to the entire property;
- b. A description of the completed work and a statement of qualification for the exemption; and
- c. If applicable, a statement that the project meets the affordable housing requirements as described in Chapter 84.14 RCW; and
- d. A statement that the work was completed within the required three-year period of the issuance of the conditional certificate of tax exemption or any authorized extension.

4. Agreement to Issue Final Certificate.

The City agrees to file a Final Certificate of Tax Exemption with the Chelan County Assessor if the Applicant has successfully completed the improvements in accordance with the terms of this Agreement, has filed the materials described in Paragraph 3 above, has paid to the County a fee in the amount of \$50.00 to cover the Assessor's administrative costs, and has met all other requirements as provided in WCC 5.88.

5. Annual Certification.

The Applicant agrees, within 30 days after the first anniversary of the date of filing the final certificate of tax exemption and each year thereafter, for the tax exemption period, the property owner shall file a notarized annual report declaration with the Director of Community Development indicating the following:

- a. A statement of occupancy and vacancy of the multifamily units during the prior 12 months ending with the anniversary date; and
- b. A certification that the property continues to be in compliance with the contract with the city, including that it has not changed use, and, if applicable, that the property has been in compliance with the affordable housing requirements as described in WCC <u>5.88.015</u> since the date of the certificate approved by the city; and
- c. A description of any subsequent improvements or changes to the property after issuance of the certificate of tax exemption; and
- d. The total monthly rent or total sale amount of each unit produced; and
- e. The income of each renter household at the time of initial occupancy and the income of each initial purchaser of owner-occupied units at the time of purchase for each of the units receiving a tax exemption.
- f. Any additional annual reporting requirements that may be required for consistency with RCW 84.14.100, as applicable.

6. Notification of transfer of interest or change in use.

Applicant agrees to notify the Department of Community Development promptly of any transfer of Applicant's ownership interest in the Property or in the improvements made to the Property under this Agreement. Applicant further agrees to notify the Department of Community Development and the Chelan County Assessor within 60 days of any change of any or all of the permanent multi-family housing developed on the Property to another use. Such change in use may result in cancellation of the tax exemption and imposition of additional taxes, interest and penalty pursuant to State law.

7. Cancellation of Exemption - Appeal.

The City reserves the right to cancel the Final Certificate of Tax Exemption if at any time the property no longer complies with the terms of this Agreement or with the requirements of WCC 5.88, or for any other reason no longer qualifies for an exemption. If the exemption is canceled for non-compliance an additional tax will be imposed that includes: (a) the difference between the tax paid and the tax that would have been owed if it had included the value of the nonqualifying improvements dated back to the date that the improvements became nonqualifying; (b) a penalty of 20% of the difference; (c) interest at the statutory rate on the tax and penalties calculated from the date the tax would have been due without penalty if the improvements had been assessed without regard to the exemptions provided by Chapter 84.14 RCW and WCC 5.88. Upon determining that a tax exemption shall be canceled, the Mayor, on behalf of the City Council, shall notify the property owner by certified mail, return receipt requested. The property owner may appeal the determination in accordance with WCC 5.88.

8. Entire Agreement and Amendments.

This document represents the entire agreement of the parties as to the subject matter of this agreement.

No modification of the Agreement shall be made unless mutually agreed upon by the parties in writing.

9. Severability.

In the event that any term or clause of this Agreement conflicts with applicable law, such conflict shall not affect other terms of this Agreement which can be given effect without the conflicting terms or clause, and to this end, the terms of the Agreement are declared to be severable.

10. No Third Party Beneficiary Created.

Nothing in this agreement is intended to create a third party beneficiary relationship with any person or entity, known or unknown, as of the date of this agreement.

11. Attorney Fees.

In the event any formal litigation is commenced between the parties to this agreement, arising out of the obligations imposed by this agreement or the interpretation of this agreement, each party shall bear their own attorney's fees and costs incurred therein.

12. Binding Effect.

This agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the heirs, successors and assigns of the parties hereto.

13. Recording.

The parties agree that this agreement shall be recorded with the Chelan County Auditor.

I. SUBJECT

Vacant Land Lease between the City of Wenatchee and Pybus Market Charitable Foundation

II. ACTION REQUESTED

Motion requested for the City Council to approve the Vacant Land Lease between the City of Wenatchee and Pybus Market Charitable Foundation and authorize the Mayor's signature

III. <u>OVERVIEW</u>

On August 25, 2022 the City Council approved the purchase of three parcels of vacant land located south of the Pybus Public Market. The vacant land has historically been used as overflow parking for Pybus through a lease with the former owners of the property. Pybus has requested to continue to lease the vacant land for overflow parking through a lease with the City of Wenatchee. The proposed Vacant Land Lease will allow Pybus to use the land at its sole cost and expense for parking for employees, vendors and customers on a month-to-month basis without a rental fee; either party may terminate the lease upon 180 days prior written notice to the other.

Staff recommends the City Council approve the Vacant Land Lease with Pybus Market Charitable Foundation.

No fiscal impact to the general fund.

In consideration of the mutual covenants in the Lease, the Lessor and the Lessee agree as follows:

1. <u>The Premises</u>. The Lessor leases to the Lessee the following described property located in the County of Chelan, commonly known as 101-125 South Worthen Street, Wenatchee, Washington, legally described as:

Parcel A

Lots 13 through 20, inclusive, Block 7, River Front Addition to Wenatchee, Chelan County, Washington, according to the plat thereof recorded in Volume 2 of Plats page 64.

TOGETHER WITH that portion of vacated Orondo Avenue and those portions of vacated alleys located in said Block 7, which would attach by operation of law. EXCEPTING THEREFROM that portion thereof conveyed to the City of Wenatchee for purposes of public right of way as recorded May 15, 2013, under Auditor's File No. 2382318.

Parcel B

Lots 8 through 12, inclusive, Block 7, River Front Addition to Wenatchee, Chelan County, Washingtonm, according to the plat thereof recorded in Volume 2 of Plats, page 64.

TOGETHER WITH the West half of the vacated alley in said Block 7 lying Easterly and adjacent to said Lots 8 through 12, inclusive, and TOGETHER with the South half of vacated alley adjacent to the North line of said Lot 12, all is vacated March 16, 1953, and June 12, 1958, by ordinance numbers 1323 and 1568.

EXCEPTING therefrom that portion thereof as conveyed to the City of Wenatchee for purposes of public right of way as recorded May 15, 2013, under Auditor's File No. 2382318.

The Lessee may improve and maintain at its sole cost and expense to the used for parking for Pybus Market Charitable Foundation and Pybus Market employees, vendors and customers.

- 2. <u>Term.</u> This Lease shall commence on the signing of this agreement and shall be on a month-to-month basis until terminated by either party as set forth herein.
- 3. <u>Rent</u>. No rent shall be paid. VACANT LAND LEASE

- 4. <u>Leasehold Excise Tax</u>. Lessee agrees to pay promptly any leasehold excise tax in such amount as is established by the Department of Revenue pursuant to state law, and will hold harmless and indemnify Lessor against the same.
- 5. <u>Termination</u>. Either party may terminate this agreement upon 180 days prior written notice to the other.
- 6. <u>Maintenance</u>. Lessee shall be responsible for pickup, disposal and removal of any garbage, trash or debris in existence or during the term of this agreement, along with keeping the vegetation in compliance with all jurisdictional authorities and using reasonable means to mitigate the dust, mud and dirt from leaving the Premises as a result of the Lessee's work and use of the Premises, including the removal of snow and ice for safe passage.
- 7. <u>Items Left in Vehicle</u>. Lessor shall not be responsible for damage or loss to possessions or items left in vehicles parked under this agreement.
- 8. <u>Assignment</u>. Lessee may not assign this Lease without the prior written consent of Lessor.
- 9. <u>Liability; Indemnification</u>. The Lessor shall in no way be liable for any personal injuries (including death) or property damage caused by or resulting from the maintenance, alterations, improvements and use of the Premises by the Lessee, or the Lessee's employees, vendors or customers. The Lessee shall indemnify, defend, and save the Lessor harmless from and against any and all liability, claims, damages, expenses, fees, penalties, legal proceedings, and causes of action of every kind, including the Lessor's costs and reasonable attorney's fees, incurred as a result of any breach by the Lessee of any covenant of this Lease, or as a result of the Lessee's use of the Premises, or the acts or omissions of the Lessee, or the Lessee's employees, vendors and customers; provided, however, that the obligation of the Lessee to indemnify shall not extend to the willful misconduct or negligence of the Lessor, or the Lessor's employees, vendors or customers.
- 10. <u>Restrictions on Use</u>. Pybus may not use or occupy the Property in violation of any law, ordinance, regulation or the certificate of occupancy issued for the Property, and may not do, bring, or keep anything in or about the Property that will cause an increased premium or the cancellation of any insurance covering the Property.
- 11. <u>Insurance</u>. The Lessee shall maintain at all times policies of liability insurance providing bodily injury and property damage per occurrence of not less than Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000) and shall name the Lessor as an Additional Insured, by policy endorsement, on a primary non-contributory basis. Lessee shall provide proof of such insurance upon reasonable request by the Lessor.

I. SUBJECT

First Amendment to Development Agreement between the City of Wenatchee and WA Mission & Kittitas Apartments, LLC

II. ACTION REQUESTED

Motion requested for the City Council to approve the First Amendment to the Development Agreement between the City of Wenatchee and WA Mission & Kittitas Apartments, LLC and authorize the Mayor's signature.

III. OVERVIEW

The City of Wenatchee previously executed a Development Agreement (Agreement) with Weidner Apartments doing business as WA Mission & Kittitas Apartments, LLC on September 27, 2019. The Agreement detailed the terms for the construction of a multi-family residential development by Weidner on the Firestone Lot owned by the City. Since then, Weidner has purchased the Firestone lot as well as other adjacent parcels for the development.

Recently, Weidner Apartments requested a two-year extension on the Agreement timelines due to the effects of the 2020 Coronavirus Pandemic and subsequent impacts to cost of materials, labor shortages, and other uncontrollable forces that caused the project to be delayed longer than originally anticipated. The proposed First Amendment to the Agreement extends the outside date for completion of the project from 60 months to 84 months and extends the vesting of codes that were in effect at the time of the agreement from 5 years to 7 years.

Staff recommends the City Council approve the First Amendment to the Agreement.

IV. FISCAL IMPACT

The original Agreement contained the following fiscal impacts pertaining to the project; waiver of impact fees, approval of a multi-family tax exemption, no cost easements and licenses, and obligated the City to construct the offsite improvements for the signalization of the intersection at Chelan and Kittitas Street. No additions or modifications to those terms have been altered as part of this proposed First Amendment.

FIRST AMENDMENT TO DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT

THIS FIRST AMENDMENT TO DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT ("this Amendment")
is made this day of, 2022, by and between the City of Wenatchee, a
Washington municipal code city ("City") and WA Mission & Kittitas Apartments LLC, a
Delaware limited liability company ("Weidner").

RECITALS:

- A. City and Weidner previously executed a Development Agreement dated September 27, 2019, which was recorded September 27, 2019, at Chelan County Auditor's File No. 2503405 (the "Agreement").
- B. City and Weidner have agreed to amend the Agreement by adding an additional two years to the deadline for completion of the project, and extending vesting for a corresponding period, as set forth in this First Amendment.

AGREEMENT:

NOW, THEREFORE, for good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the parties hereby agree as follows:

- 1. <u>Vesting</u>. Section 2.1 of the Agreement shall be and hereby is amended to read, in pertinent part, as follows:
 - "2.1 <u>Vesting</u>. The provisions of the Wenatchee Zoning Code and City development regulations, such as international building and fire codes, in effect on the date of this Agreement shall apply to the design and development of the Project for the full duration of this Agreement but not to exceed seven years...."
- 2. <u>Weidner Responsibilities</u>. Section 3.1(a) of the Agreement shall be and hereby is amended to read as follows:

"a. <u>Project</u>. Weidner agrees to construct the Project as conceptually shown in Exhibit "B" within 36 months after the City issues a building permit and not later than 84 months from the date of this Agreement, subject to delay caused by force majeure and the acts and or omissions of the City."

2. <u>Full Force and Effect</u>. City and Weidner agree that the Agreement, as amended by this First Amendment, is in full force and effect and is a valid and binding obligation of City and Weidner as if it had never been amended.

3. <u>Signatures; Counterparts</u>. This First Amendment may be executed in counterparts that, when assembled, shall form one document, and signatures executed via facsimile, email, or DocuSign shall have the same force and effect as originals.

I. SUBJECT

II. ACTION REQUESTED

Staff recommends the City Council approve Ordinance 2022-29 amending the 2022 budget as adopted by Ordinance 2021-30 and amended by Ordinance 2022-11, revoking, recalling or decreasing all or a portion of total appropriations provided for, entering findings that this ordinance is in the best interest of the City and requiring that this Ordinance be approved by a majority plus one of the entire Council.

III. OVERVIEW

When the 2022 budget was adopted in 2021, several projects and budget needs were not anticipated. In June, the Council approved several budget amendments with Ordinance 2022-11 to provide necessary legal authority to make purchases in the middle of the year.

As the end of the year approaches, City departments have worked with the Finance Department to determine which funds require additional budget authority. Each of these budget requests were brought to Finance Committee by City Staff and discussed in detail. The budget amendment will provide the necessary legal authority to complete projects and provide resources already approved by the Finance Committee.

This budget amendment ensures several funds of the City do not exceed original budget appropriations, as required by law. These amendments have been reviewed by Finance Committee.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WENATCHEE DO ORDAIN as

follows:

SECTION I

Ordinance No. 2021-30 adopting the 2022 Budget, as subsequently amended by Ordinance No. 2022-11, be and the same is hereby amended by decreasing, revoking or recalling all or a portion of total appropriations and re-appropriating for another purpose or purposes, without limitation to department, division or fund, the use of such monies as is set forth on Exhibit "A" attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference.

SECTION II

This Ordinance is adopted pursuant to the authority of RCW 35A.33.120.

SECTION III

The facts and findings for this Ordinance are that the budget, as originally adopted and amended for the year 2022, needs to be amended so as to balance the budget and to appropriate funds to maintain the public peace, safety and welfare.

SECTION IV

This Ordinance is adopted by at least a majority plus one vote of the City Council as required by the authority set forth in Section II hereof.

I. SUBJECT

Ordinance 2022-28, adopting the 2023 Budget

II. ACTION REQUESTED

Staff recommends the City Council approve Ordinance #2022-28 adopting the final budget for the City of Wenatchee for fiscal year 2023.

III. OVERVIEW

The 2023 budget was developed through a group effort of the Mayor, Finance Committee, Department Directors and staff across city departments. The Finance Department worked with the Mayor and Finance Committee to review requests from the department directors. The base 2023 budget was developed by estimating salaries and benefits of existing positions, rolling over recurring supplies and service expenses, updating interfund activity, contract adjustments, and revenue projections. Additional department requests for operating and capital items were reviewed by Finance Committee and added to the budget.

The 2023 budget includes almost \$59 million in capital projects such as, City Pool Liner Replacement, Community Center Facility Improvements, Columbia Street, Springwater Avenue, Apple Capital Loop, Confluence Parkway North, WWTP Digester 4, Broadview Stormwater Improvements, WWTP Drying Bed Expansion, and many other parks, economic development, facilities, streets and utility projects.

The 2023 budget totals \$142,001,240 in expenses and \$123,132,630 in revenues. The General fund is budgeted for \$35,296,650 in expenses and \$31,717,800 in revenues. More details can be found in the full 2023 budget document.

IV. FISCAL IMPACT

The adoption of the 2023 budget is required for any City expenditure to be incurred in 2023. This has been reviewed by Finance Committee.

WHEREAS, the said City Council did hold a public hearing at that time and place and did then consider the matter of the proposed budget for the fiscal year 2023; and

WHEREAS, the said proposed budget does not exceed the lawful limit of taxation allowed by law to be levied on the property within the City for the purposes set forth in the budget, and the estimated expenditures set forth in the budget are all necessary to carry on the government of the City for the fiscal year 2023 and is sufficient to meet the various needs of the City during that period.

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Wenatchee, do ordain as follows:

SECTION I

The budget for the City of Wenatchee, Washington, for the year 2023 is hereby adopted at the fund level in its final form and content as set forth in the comprehensive budget document, "2023 Budget, City of Wenatchee, Washington", copies of which are on file in the Office of the City Clerk.

SECTION II

Estimated resources, including fund balances for each separate fund of the City of Wenatchee, for the year 2023 are set forth in summary form in Exhibit "A", and are hereby appropriated for expenditure at the fund level during the year 2023 as set forth in the "2023 Budget, City of Wenatchee, Washington."

SECTION III

Detailed budgets for each capital project of the City of Wenatchee, for the year 2023 are set forth in Exhibit "B", and are hereby approved as set forth in the "2023 Budget, City of Wenatchee, Washington."

SECTION IV

The City Clerk is directed to transmit a certified copy of the budget hereby adopted to the State Auditor's Office and to the Association of Washington Cities.

SECTION V

This ordinance shall be in full force and take effect five days after its publication.
