CALL TO ORDER: The meeting was called to order at 4:01 p.m. by Chair Harmon **IN ATTENDANCE:** Koski, Rohrbach, Harmon, Koester, Mattioda, Kassebaum,

REGULAR AGENDA:

- 1. February 21, 2023 Commission Meeting Minutes. Commissioner Koski moved approval of the February 21, 2023 meeting minutes. Commissioner Mattioda seconded the motion. The motion passed 5-0.
- 2. North Wenatchee Avenue Banners. Heather Dappen presented the five refined banners for the project via Zoom. The Commissioners were supportive of the banners presented. The banners will go to the fabricators for final design and cost estimating and also be presented at the upcoming Public Works Committee meeting.
- **3. Recreation Program Report.** Caryl Andre from the Recreation Division presented a summary report describing recreation programs that are offered to the community.
- **3. Parks, Recreation and Open Space Plan Update.** Commissioners were asked to provide comment on the second and third chapters of the plan. Comments that were received were incorporated into the document. Next month, the survey results and chapter four are planned to be presented.
- **4. Project Updates.** Along with the report provided in the agenda packet, the department director provided additional updates about the Lincoln Park Project, Kenzie's Landing Project, Rotary Park Project, Native Peoples Project, Highway 2/Easy Street Roundabout Art work.

Five additional items were presented for discussion and possible action. The first item was informational regarding the Saddle Rock Trail planning process led by CDLT. Appleatchee raised concerns over mountain bike use and the need for horse trailer parking at Saddle Rock. Horse trailer parking was included in the original plans for the parking area however it was removed based on Appleatchee objections to having horse trailer parking there. Evergreen/CDLT would like to see additional parking to accommodate peak time uses. Two parking options were discussed. One option shows an overflow parking loop with 17 spots and the option includes two horse trailer parking spaces. The item will be brought back to the Commission for further discussion at a later date.

The second item was the potential donation of the sculpture Rozanne's Tango to the City collection by the artist Kevin Pettelle. Following a presentation and discussion, *Commissioner Koski moved with Koester seconding that the sculpture donation be accepted and to forward the recommendation to the City Council for consideration. The motion passed unanimously.*

Item three was a discussion about the potential donation of up to nine sculptures from artist Bernard Hosey. The artist passed away and the sculptures were made available by the estate. Following a discussion, consensus was reached on a ranked list of the sculptures. The top three included: Sphere Pilot House, Slab Gate and Ironworks. Staff will work with the donor to finalize the potential donation and schedule it for City Council consideration.

The fourth item was the potential short-term display of a sculpture that would be on loan from artist Robert Wicks. The sculpture is currently located on 9th street and would be on loan for one to two years. With the high volume of the public art collection that will need to be relocated over the next two years from the Riverfront and Convention Center projects, the Commission elected to not pursue the loan.

The final item was the potential donation of the former Junior Ridge to River Obstacle Course equipment. Staff was contacted by one of the former organizers of the event who would like to donate the tires, rope swings and other homemade equipment to the City for potential location in Hale Park. The Commission appreciated the gesture, however following a discussion and concern over liability, the Commission decided to not pursue the donation. Staff will follow up.

- **5. Grant report.** A report was included in the agenda packet. The Lincoln Park grants will be closed out in May, Kenzie's Landing grant is closed and a new DNR Community Forestry Grant application was prepared and submitted.
- **6. City Council items.** A list of City Council items was provided. Several items are scheduled for the April 13 meeting.
- **7. Commissioner Comments.** There were no comments.

Chelan Douglas Developmental Disabilities Grants

The grant provides funding support of the Special Needs Social Program. The \$8,500 request for the 2022/23 program year was awarded.

Lincoln Park RCO Youth Athletic Facilities Grant

The \$263,192 grant would construct the full-size soccer/lacrosse field, new restrooms and safety fencing in Lincoln Park. Construction ongoing. Closing out the grant next month.

Lincoln Park Improvement RCO WWRP Local Parks Grant

The \$500,000 grant will replace the stage and play area; add a water play area, second picnic shelter, bmx pump park, trees and upgrade utilities and parking in Lincoln Park. Construction ongoing. Closing out the grant next month.

Lincoln Park Improvement RCO LWCF Grant

The \$500,000 grant application will replace the stage and play area; add a water play area, second picnic shelter, bmx pump park, trees and upgrade utilities and parking in Lincoln Park. Construction ongoing. Closing out the grant next month.

Department of Ecology Remedial Action Grant

A second \$1,244,170 grant for the second phase of the Saddle Rock remediation project was approved. Awaiting the release of the Agreed Order.

City Pool RCO Youth Athletic Facilities Grant

The \$350,000 grant application to provide a portion of the funding required to replace the plaster liner and tiles in the pool. Finalized construction contract. Project set to begin July 31, 2023.

State Capital Budget Request

Worked with Senator Hawkins, submitted and received a \$533,500 capital budget request for the pool project. Finalized construction contract. Project set to begin July 31, 2023.

Foothills RCO WWRP Local Parks Grant

This project will acquire approximately 650 acres in the foothills for non-motorized recreation, education and habitat purposes. Two properties finished one final property in negotiation. Requested and received an extension through the end of 2023.

RCO WWRP Local Parks Grant

This project will acquire approximately 134 acres in the foothills for non-motorized recreation, education and habitat purposes. The application ranked 3rd statewide and should receive full funding in 2023. The contract is anticipated to be received in July/August. With CDLT, prepared and submitted the certification of match form.

DNR Community Forestry Assistance Grant

Applied for a \$20,000 grant to assist with the funding of updating the City tree inventory and assessment. Notification should be made in late April/early May.
