BACKGROUND:

For the past 10 months the Parks, Recreation and Cultural Services Department has worked to prepare an update of the six-year Parks, Recreation and Open Space (PROS) Plan. The process to update the plan included a community wide survey, City Council workshop, review of existing plans and documents and eight public meetings.

The PROS plan establishes a framework to guide the acquisition, development and improvement of park areas and facilities and the provision of recreational services throughout the City of Wenatchee. The plan is for the 2024-2030 time period.

The City is required to have an adopted plan which is approved by the State to be eligible for a number of grant programs. Grant eligibility is scheduled to expire at the end of this year.

The draft was sent to the State for review. They commented: "Everything looks great, meets our Manual 2 requirements, and I would have no issue with approving this for both recreation and conservation grant programs once it comes to me in final form."

Upon adoption by City Council, staff would prepare and submit the checklists and other documents that are required by the State.





Chelan Douglas Developmental Disabilities Grants

The grant provides funding support of the Special Needs Social Program. The \$8,500 request for the 2023/24 program year was awarded.

City Pool RCO Youth Athletic Facilities Grant

The \$700,000 grant project will provide a portion of the funding required to replace the plaster liner and tiles in the pool. **Project underway.**

State Capital Budget Request

Worked with Senator Hawkins, submitted and received a \$533,500 capital budget request for the pool project. **Project underway.**

Foothills RCO WWRP Local Parks Grant

This project will acquire approximately 650 acres in the foothills for non-motorized recreation, education and habitat purposes. **One final property in negotiation. Must be completed by December 31, 2023.**

RCO WWRP Local Parks Grant

This project will acquire approximately 134 acres in the foothills for non-motorized recreation, education and habitat purposes. The application ranked 3rd statewide and should receive full funding in 2023. The contract was received and accepted by the City Council. It was executed by the State.

RCO WWRP Maintenance Grant

This project is anticipated to provide \$100,000 funding for the Lincoln Park Baseball Field Project. Applications are due September 18 and potential award in October.

Historic Cemetery Preservation Capital Grant

This project would provide funding to purchase and install section signs and an information kiosk and sign for the Cemetery. The application would be for less than \$50,000. Applications are due in October with potential award in January 2024.
