## 5:15 p.m. Regular Meeting

**1.** Call to Order, Pledge of Allegiance, and Roll Call. Mayor Mike Poirier called the meeting to order at 5:15 p.m. Mayor Poirier asked Veteran Larry Nicholas to lead the Pledge of Allegiance. Councilmembers Linda Herald and Keith Huffaker were absent.

Motion by Councilmember Top Rojanasthien to excuse the absences of Councilmembers Linda Herald and Keith Huffaker. Councilmember Travis Hornby seconded the motion. Motion carried (5-0).

## 2. Citizen Requests/Comments

Larry Nicholas, 337 Methow, Wenatchee, addressed the Council with his concerns about utility bills and would like the city to take a look at age and income discounts. Mayor Poirier recently met with Mr. Nicholas, and the city is in the process of reviewing.

Charlie Hickenbottom, 127 South Franklin, Wenatchee, thanked the Mayor and Council for the complete streets policy adopted in 2016. He also thanked them for listening to his suggestion about adding bicycle parking as part of the convention center remodel. Additionally, he addressed his concerns with the Reimagine Wenatchee plan.

Carlos Corales, 124 North James, East Wenatchee, and owner of The Crepe House in Wenatchee, announced they were celebrating their one-year anniversary and are holding a fundraiser to provide 500 backpacks to local school children, including supplies and hygienic items.

**A.** Contract Amendment for 8MG Reservoir Improvement Project and Fifth and Miller Street 24" Transmission Line Valve Replacement

Deputy Public Works Director-Utilities Jessica Shaw presented the staff report. Council asked questions.

Motion by Councilmember Travis Hornby for City Council to approve contract amendments 2 and 3 with Gray and Osborne, Project No. 2306, and authorize the City Administrator to sign the contract amendments. Councilmember Chelsea Ewer seconded the motion. Motion carried (5-0).

**B.** Wastewater Treatment Plant Administration Building and Public Services Center Utilities Garage, Project No. 2403 Authorization to Award the Design Contract to Jacobs Engineering

Deputy Public Works Director-Utilities Jessica Shaw presented the staff report. Council commented and asked questions.

Motion by Councilmember Travis Hornby for City Council to approve the award of the design contract for the Wastewater Treatment Plant Administration Building and Public Services Center Utilities Garage, Project No. 2403 to Jacobs Engineering and authorize the City Administrator to sign the Professional Service Contract for the design on behalf of the City. Councilmember Jose Cuevas seconded the motion. Motion carried (5-0).

## 6. Public Hearing Items

Mayor Poirier called the public hearing to order and stated the procedures for the public hearing.

C. 2024 Community Development Block Grant Annual Action Plan

Community Development Director Glen DeVries presented the staff report. Project Engineer Zach Horton provided information on the First Street project.

Council commented and asked questions.

The Mayor then asked for public comment.

Larry Nicholas, 337 Methow Street, Wenatchee, asked why his neighborhood sidewalks are all torn up and not scheduled for improvements.

Motion by Councilmember Charlie Atkinson for City Council to approve the 2024 Community Development Block Grant Annual Action Plan as presented and to authorize the Mayor to sign all associated assurances, certifications and contracts necessary for implementing the 2024 Community Development Block Grant Annual Action Plan. Councilmember Travis Hornby seconded the motion. Motion carried (5-0).

- a. Mayor's Report. Mayor Mike Poirier reported on the following:
  - (1) He attended the Purple Heart City ceremony on Wednesday evening at Pybus.
  - (2) He thanked Councilmember Rojanasthien for filling in for him while he was on vacation.

- (3) National Night Out was held on Tuesday, and was the best turnout ever had. Councilmember Cuevas was at CAFÉ and Councilmember Herald at Washington Park.
- (4) The Mayor was a speaker at Wenatchee Rotary this week.
- (5) The City of East Wenatchee also voted no to the proposed revised Interlocal Agreement with Rivercom.
- (6) City Administrator Laura Gloria said everyone should have received a calendar invite for a joint meeting with the City of East Wenatchee for an update on the homeless approach strategy and the meeting will allow public comments.
- (7) She also reported that she and staff have been busy updating our State Representatives on the Confluence Parkway project.
